Here are some questions to keep in mind to make sure you are hitting the key shifts for CCRS and ELPS: Complexity, Evidence, Knowledge:

Complexity: Am I using more than one source? Does the reading contain different sections, graphics, maps, or charts? Is the vocabulary appropriate for the level of the student, and does it need specific instruction? Is the length challenging to the level of the student?

Evidence: Do my questions refer the students back to the reading? Are students supporting their responses with evidence? Do students have to draw conclusions not directly found in the text?

Knowledge: What knowledge are they gaining? Are the texts non-fiction, informational, or found in the real world? Are you diving deep rather than skimming the surface of a lot of topics?
